- Exhibits must be grown by exhibitor.
- Exhibits may be checked in from 1:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M., Wednesday, September 29.
- Only one exhibit may be made per class, except as noted below.
- Any exhibit that does not fit into a class may be entered under the appropriate miscellaneous class (D-20 or E-10) at the discretion of the Superintendent. More than one exhibit may be shown in this class if the exhibit is not a duplicate of another class.
- Vases will be provided by fair officials.
- Open to adults and juniors.
- Superintendent has the authority to determine which class item is to be entered in and to reject improper quality items.
- Ribbons and exhibits must be picked up between 2:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M., Monday, Oct. 4.
- Premiums will be paid on the Danish System of judging.
- Unless requested not to at check-in, cut specimens will be discarded at 2:00 p.m. Monday, Oct. 4.
- To expedite the entry process, exhibitors should have flowers ready to present at check-in. Exhibitors should know into which class each entry should be exhibited.
- Flowing cannas and species that flower for one day only will not be accepted.
