Entries in this department open only to exhibitors between the ages of 9-19 who comply with Rule No. 40.

The management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit or animal that may be falsely entered, or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable, without assigning a reason therefore, and if necessary, to return any money already paid for space or stalls which shall exonerate the Show from any claims whatsoever on the part of the exhibitor.

All junior exhibitors will be allowed to enter their animals in the Open Division provided they meet all entry and fee requirements.

REGULATIONS

1. Entries close August 15. Entries must be in the office of the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair, P.O. Box 4145, Fort Smith, Arkansas 72914, or postmarked by the post office by this date. An entry fee of \$7 per head will be charged for each entry in the Junior Breeding Sheep Division. SEE RULE 10 IN THE GENERAL RULES.

Late entries in the LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT, if accepted, will be charged double the amount of the entry fee. Class substitutions on existing entries may be made at a cost of \$12.00 entry fee. This must be handled at the MAIN OFFICE - prior to check-in of animals. ABSOLUTELY no entry will be accepted after September 1st.

NO REFUND WILL BE MADE AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE. A \$25.00 charge will be assessed for checks returned from the bank for any reason.

EXHIBITOR ENTRY STATEMENT

See Exhibitors General Rules and Regulations, page 12.

Exhibitor Entry Statement (back of entry form) must be signed and returned to the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair office WITH the Exhibitor Entry Form. If the statement is not signed or returned with the entry form the exhibitor's entry will be returned.

2. No Junior Breeding Sheep will be allowed to enter the fairgrounds before 3:00 P.M. on Friday, October 1. All Junior Breeding Sheep must be in place in pens assigned by the superintendent by 8:00 P.M. Friday, October 1 and remain on exhibition until 7:00 P.M. Saturday, October 2. All Junior Breeding Sheep must enter Gate 6 on Plum Street during official check in hours only.

3. **All sheep must have a Scrapies Premise ID tag showing breeder and owner.** Registration papers are necessary on animals in breeding stock. ***NEW!*** No pending registration papers will be accepted on animals born before Jan. 1, 2010.

JUNIOR SHEEP

Superintendents must check on the exhibits competing for premiums in each class, and so mark the entry book that it will show what animals were exhibited in each class, as well as which were awarded premiums. Entry book must give names and registry numbers of all animals, as premiums cannot be paid unless this is done.

4. Premiums are set up on a point basis in the Junior Department and the value of the points will be as explained in Rule No. 40. **No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two premiums in any one class and only one premium on group classes.**

5. All stalls must be cleaned before 8:00 A.M. each day and refuse disposed of as Superintendent may direct. **No carpet or mats allowed.**

6. Premier exhibitor entries need not be made in this class. The exhibitor winning the most money in the Junior Show will be Premier Exhibitor. A minimum of three exhibitors, with not less than five head per exhibitor, is required. This award will be for each breed or between breeds, depending on exhibitor participation.

7. All breeding sheep will have ear tags for identification and must match number on registration papers.

8. Fall lambs may have two permanent teeth NOT in wear.

9. Yearlings will have no more than two permanent teeth.

10. Registration papers, ear tags, and teeth will be checked before showing.
