1. Entries open only to exhibitors between the ages of 9-19 who comply with Rule 40.

2. **Entries close August 15. Entries must be in the office of the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair, P.O. Box 4145, Fort Smith, Arkansas 72914, or postmarked by post office by this date. All entries must be accompanied by entry fees. SEE RULE 10 IN THE GENERAL RULES.**

Late entries in the **LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT**, if accepted, will be charged double the amount of the entry fee. Class substitutions on existing entries may be made at a cost of 1/2 plus the regular entry fee. **ABSOLUTELY no entry or substitutions will be accepted after September 1st.**

NO REFUND WILL BE MADE AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE. A \$25.00 charge will be assessed for checks returned from the bank for any reason.

EXHIBITOR ENTRY STATEMENT

See Exhibitors General Rules and Regulations, page 12.

Exhibitor Entry Statement (back of entry form) must be signed and returned to the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair office **WITH the Exhibitor Entry Form. If the statement is not signed** or returned with the entry form the exhibitor's entry will be returned.

3. No Market Swine will be allowed to enter the fairgrounds before 8:00 A.M. Friday, September 24. All Market Swine must be in place in pens assigned by superintendent by 8:00 P.M. Friday, September 24 and remain on exhibition until 2:00 P.M. Sunday, September 26, except sale order animals. **All Junior animals and equipment must be out of the barn by 9:00 P.M. Sunday, September 26.** All Swine must enter Gate 6 on Plum Street during official check in hours only.

4. Each exhibitor shall be responsible for keeping pens and alleys in a clean condition. **All pens and alleys shall be thoroughly cleaned each morning.**

5. **NO PAINT OR PAINT PRODUCTS. VIOLATION WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION.**

6. All market swine must weigh between 220 and 270 pounds to show. There will be a weigh back. The number of hogs weighed will be at the discretion of the swine superintendent. Weigh back will be 10 lbs. over the hog on the entry card.

JUNIOR SWINE

7. Swine will be shown by breed (as listed above) and weight. Classes will be determined after all entries are in. If there are not 10 animals representing the above breeds, they will show in crossbreeds.

8. There will be no official weigh-in. Exhibitors will weigh their own animals and submit that weight to the swine superintendent by 8:00 p.m. Friday, September 24. Show classes for each breed will then be determined. Classes will be kept as uniform in size as possible and will be posted.

9. Each exhibitor may enter only one swine in the show.

10. All swine must be owned by exhibitor sixty days prior to show.

11. All swine selected for sale order will be automatically entered in Carcass contest.

12. Administration of a drug – See General Rules, Page 15, Paragraph 9.

13. An exhibitor may show a barrow or a gilt.

14. Any hog shown in the wrong class will be disqualified.

15. Pens will be assigned upon arrival by swine superintendent.

16. Two cards turned in on the same animal will result in disqualification.

17. Exhibitors may not reserve or “hold” pens for later arriving exhibitors or pigs. Exhibitors wishing to pen together must arrive together. However, due to limited space, pigs will be penned at the discretion of the swine/barn superintendent.

18. Exhibitors are allowed to bring tack in early. However, pen assignments will not be made until pigs arrive on the fairgrounds. Tack will be placed in a designated area until the pigs arrive. No tack allowed in pens.

19. Due to limited pen space, 2-3 pigs will be assigned to each pen. Individuals should bring panels to separate their pigs. - 4' x 8' pens

20. The swine superintendent will distribute entry cards after the pigs have been placed in an assigned pen. EXHIBITORS WILL NOT RECEIVE AN ENTRY CARD UNTIL THEIR PIG IS IN THEIR ASSIGNED PEN.

21. Exhibitors who have not returned a completed entry card by 8:00 p.m., Fri., Sept. 24th, will be required to remove their animal from the fairgrounds.

22. Any exhibitor, chapter or club dismantling or changing the shape of a 4' x 8' pen will cause the disqualification of the entire group.
