Entries might be limited according to capacity of barns available. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt when accompanied by entry fees.

1. Entries close August 15. Entries must be in the office of the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair, P.O. Box 4145, Fort Smith, Arkansas 72914, or postmarked by this date, and accompanied by entry fees.

SEE RULE 10 IN THE GENERAL RULES.

Late entries in the LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT, if accepted, will be charged double the amount of the entry fee. Class substitutions on existing entries may be made at a cost of 1/2 plus the regular entry fee. ABSOLUTELY no entry will be accepted after September 1. Substitutions may be made only in the same breed. This must be handled at the MAIN OFFICE - prior to check-in of animals.

NO REFUND WILL BE MADE AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE. A \$25.00 charge will be assessed for checks returned from the bank for any reason.

EXHIBITOR ENTRY STATEMENT

See Exhibitors General Rules and Regulations, page 11.

Exhibitor Entry Statement (back of entry form) must be signed and returned to the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair office WITH the Exhibitor Entry Form. If the statement is not signed or returned with the entry form the exhibitor's entry will be returned.

2. No open dairy will be allowed to enter the fairgrounds before 8:00 A.M. Tuesday, September 28. All open dairy must be in place in stalls assigned by the superintendent by 8:00 P.M. September 28 and remain in exhibition until released 6:00 P.M. Saturday, October 2. All open dairy must enter Gate 6 on Plum Street during official check in hours.

3. Registration papers and proof of ownership, with Bang's certificate or calfhood vaccination, must be shown to appropriate individual at the entry gate. ***NEW!* No pending registration papers will be accepted on animals born before Jan. 2010.**

4. Only first place winners in single classes in open competition and Junior Division may compete for champion and only champion winners may compete for grand champion.

5. All stalls must be cleaned before 9:00 A.M. each day and the refuse disposed of as Superintendent may direct. Straw bedding will be allowed.

6. Cows in milk must be milked completely and thoroughly after 6:00 P.M. on the day before the cattle are to be judged.

7. Artificial means of removing or remedying physical defects of conformation in exhibition animals, such as lifting or filling under the skin, will be considered fraud and deception. All animals giving evidence of such treatment will be barred from exhibition at the Fair, and at all Fairs holding membership in the International Association of Fairs and Expositions.

8. Not over two premiums will be awarded in any individual class to any one exhibitor.

9. Markings or tattoo numbers must match registration papers.

10. All cattle shall be entered in class shown on initial entry form, i.e., cattle cannot be changed from open to junior division or visa-versa. Only cattle entered may be shown.

11. Two-year-old heifers **may** be shown **before** freshening.

12. Animals entered and exhibited in the division must all be from one single herd, running together and operating at one location as a nit owned by an individual, or by a corporation, or by a partnership, or by a working family unit. Cattle must be entered and shown as one herd. (Farm name is recommended.)

13. Yearling heifers in milk must be shown in two-year-old heifer class.

14. ***Now!* Group classes must be on entry forms to be eligible to show.**

15. Premier Exhibitor Award – The exhibitor winning the most points on animals not exceeding 8 head, owned and exhibited by himself in the open single classes shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. The scale of points will be the same as the same as determining Premier Breeder.

OPEN DAIRY

16. Premier Breeder Award – The breeder winning the most points on – not to exceed eight animals in the open single classes, exhibited by himself and/or other exhibitors shall be designated the Premier Breeder. The point system for determining Premier Breeder is as follows:

Entries in this department open only to exhibitors who comply with Rule No. 40.

All junior exhibitors will be allowed to enter their animals in the Open Division provided they meet all entry and fee requirements.

Special Award: A \$400 scholarship will be awarded upon college enrollment to the exhibitor showing the Supreme Champion Dairy animal. The exhibitor showing the Reserve Supreme Champion animal will receive a \$250 scholarship. These scholarships are donated by Arkansas-Oklahoma Regional Educational and Promotion Association, Inc.

REGULATIONS

1. Entries close August 15. Entries must be in the office of the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair, P.O. Box 4145, Fort Smith, Arkansas 72914, or postmarked by this date. All entries must be accompanied by the entry fee of \$12.00 per entry in the Junior Dairy Division. SEE RULE 10 IN THE GENERAL RULES.

Late entries in the LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT, if accepted, will be charged double the amount of the entry fee. Class substitutions on existing entries may be made at a cost of 1/2 plus the regular entry fee. ABSOLUTELY no entry will be accepted after September 1. Substitutions may be made only in the same breed. This must be handled at the MAIN OFFICE - prior to check-in of animals.

NO REFUND WILL BE MADE AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE. A \$25.00 charge will be assessed for checks returned from the bank for any reason.

2. No Junior Dairy will be allowed to enter the fairgrounds before 8:00 A.M. Tuesday, September 28. All Junior Dairy must be in place in stalls assigned by the superintendent by 8:00 P.M. September 28 and remain in exhibition until released 6:00 P.M. Saturday, October 2. All Junior Dairy must enter Gate 6 on Plum Street during official check in hours.

3. Registration papers and proof of ownership, with Bang's certificate or calffood vaccination, must be shown to appropriate individual at the entry gate. **NEW: No pending registration papers will be accepted on animals born before January 1, 2010.**

4. Only first place winners in single classes in the Junior Division may compete for champions and only champion winners may compete for grand champion.

5. All stalls must be cleaned before 9:00 A.M. each day and the refuse disposed of as Superintendent may direct. Straw bedding will be allowed.

6. There must be 3 exhibitors in each breed to qualify for trophies.

7. Premiums are set up on a point basis in the Junior Department and the value of the points will be as explained in Rule 41.

8. Markings or tattoo numbers must match registration papers.

9. Not over two premiums will be awarded in any individual class to any one exhibitor.

10. Junior Cattle must be shown by owner. Only cattle entered may be shown.

11. Two-year-old heifers **may** be shown **before** freshening.

12. Animals entered and exhibited in the division must all be from one single herd, running together and operating at one location as a nit owned by an individual, or by a corporation, or by a partnership, or by a working family unit. Cattle must be entered and shown as one herd.

13. Yearling heifers in milk must be shown in two-year-old heifer class.

14. **NEW: Group classes must be on entry forms to be eligible to show.**
