IMPORTANT: Age limits are from 13 to 21, inclusive. At the time of the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair, acts must consist of only members within the specified age limits. Youth Talent acts must run no more than **4 minutes**. An official timekeeper will be present during the contest. Any act running over 4 minutes will be disqualified.

The finals of the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair Youth Talent Contest will be held on Sunday, September 26 at 7:00 P.M. in Harper Stadium. The preliminary contest begins Saturday, September 25. Preliminary contest assignments will be mailed to the address on the entry form. **NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE ONCE THE SCHEDULES ARE SENT.**

DEADLINE FOR ENTRY IS SEPTEMBER 3, 2010.

YOUTH TALENT CONTEST RULES

1. Age limits are 13 through 21, inclusive. All contestants must be at least 13 years of age and not more than 21 years of age on the day of the ARKANSAS-OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR TALENT CONTEST FINALS.
2. All Youth Talent Contestants must be of AMATEUR status. A definition of a professional is available upon request.
3. No act may run over 4 minutes. Any act that runs overtime will be disqualified.
4. Baton twirlers or similar acts using batons or machetes, knives, etc. will not be accepted.
5. No fire, smoke, or smoke effect will be allowed on stage during the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair Talent Contest.
6. A contestant may enter the Contest only once as a solo and once in a group.
7. All props must be inanimate, with the exception of use in a variety type act.
